PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the other two motions I have. The reason is to not waste any time, and I ask to call the Roll and pass them. The Legislature has adopted it's opinion. Let's go along with what the majority wants. That's the name of the game.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter is asking to withdraw his two motions. So they haven't been voted on, he can do that. Now Senator Duis, is up first, Senator Keyes. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Is there proper time now to make other motions. That's all I'm asking from the Chair.

PRESIDENT: Certainly, if they relate to the veto. Now Senator Keyes, and then Senator Marsh. Senator Keyes is passing. What do you care to do.

SENATOR KEYES: ON my no vote on that one, now just try me on LB1055 once.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, I move we override on the next items items of business.

PRESIDENT: Take them one at a time, Senator. Do you want 1054 first. All right, thank you.

CLERK: All right, Mr. President, I move that LB1054 be passed into law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor. Signed Senator Marsh.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh. Stand by. Wait until she signs that motion. The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, without taking any more of this body's time, I move we take the vote on overriding the Governor's veto on LB1054.

PRESIDENT: Stand by, Senator Kelly would like to be heard. Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I'd like to know something about this \$2,366,000 for the University. And I'd consider that well worth a little time.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Kelly has an inquiry. Senator Marsh do you want to answer or defer to Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARSH: I would be glad to try unless....

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh has the floor.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, on UNL on 1054 there is \$575,484. taken out of the continuation budget. There is \$355,000 taken out of the plant operation and maintenance funds, including \$30,000 for security, which I feel is very important. There is
