PRESIDENT: The tellers agree and the Chair does declare that Senator Maurice Kremer is the winner and the Chairman of the Public Works Committee. We go to Revenue. Senator Herb Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, it gives me pleasure to nominate Senator Cal Carsten as Chairman of the Revenue Committee. SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am happy to place in nomination the name of Senator Walter George, Chairman of the Urban Affairs Committee.
