PRESIDENT LUEDTKE PRESIDING

CHAPLAIN: Prayer offered.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Roll call.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Venditte would like to be excused until he arrives and Senator Merz would like to be excused for the balance of the day.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Have you all registered your presence for roll call? Have you all recorded your presence? Record the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Show Senator Reutzel and Senator Clark here. The Chair recognizes Senator Fowler for the purpose of a motion on the rules for the day. Senator Fowler. The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp for the purpose of the motion.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I move that the rules of the last legislative session be adopted for this day only.
