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might be strong enough motivation and reason to pass this resolution. I have an amendment on the desk and if the Clerk would read that, if he can read that, I think we would expedite this a little faster.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Read the amendment.

CLERK: Read Newell amendment found on page 139 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Now, Senator Newell, speaking to your amendment.

SENATOR NEWELL: Let's deal with five before we deal with four. I just wanted to have something to do with it and that is why I suggested that I might serve on the sub-committee. Number four which is the substantive part of this motion deals with some inaccurate figures that I provided for the cost of the sculptures. I hate to admit this but the sculptures are going to cost far more than the \$1,000 that I suggested and for that reason, keeping with the fiscal conservatism and the fact that there is not a lot of room in these hearing rooms anyway for the statues and that other places in the Capitol have statues of many of these political figures who have been proposed, that portraits might be much more in keeping and along with these portraits maybe a little biographical sketch alongside the portrait would be of some merit for the persons who would...for Nebraska citizens who would come before these various committees and be aware of these political figures. So, Senator Lamb, who is getting excited about the statues and their great cost, this amendment should make it reasonable, much more cost efficient and for that reason I offer this amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to speak to the Newell amendment to the resolution? The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Yes, Mr. Speaker. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Senator Newell, if you could simply strike paragraph four I would be able to support this in its entirety. As it is now there may be family members who, because of the honor of naming a room after their deceased family member, may have a portrait they would like to give. I think that is a technicality that can be worked out later but because of the dollars involved in commissioning a portrait to be painted, I think that would have to be a bill and go through
