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SENATOR NEWELL: Senator Koch, I think it would be wrong for this state to not recognize that certain key political figures and those figures who have never served in this body that I would think would be prime candidates would be gentlemen like Senator George Norris and William Jennings Bryan, both who did not serve in the Legislature of the state but who served nationally and became nationally politically prominent and had impact. As you well know, George Norris was the father of the Unicameral. He was the father of this body and for that reason I think he is a natural person to be recognized.

SENATOR KOCH: I tried to name the Sports Complex after George Norris.

SENATOR NEWELL: I know and we fought hard on that fight because I also felt that George Norris deserved that kind of recognition but maybe this is the more appropriate place to recognize George Norris than the Sports Complex.

SENATOR KOCH: Seriously then and I will support the resolution but I think for the good of this body that the controlling committee which I understand would be the Executive Committee, that they develop rules that have to be adopted by this body to stipulate how these people are selected and to make it a very unique appointment once they have been recognized and I agree with Senator Murphy. I do not sincerely believe that a person should be placed in a position like this in perpetuity. I believe there should be something in those rules that allows the body to change that after a period of time and that that plaque or whatever it is be moved somewhere else in the Chamber as being recognized at one time and I would hope that the Executive Committee would develop rules and regulations that are very strict, cannot be abused because we do know occasionally forces outside this body lobby for certain individuals for high honor and I would suggest that the rules be developed that are not easily bent out of shape.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers and then Senator Haberman.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would just like to point out a few things that could arise from this resolution. Dave, you pointed out that many of us can not find the hearing rooms but these people from my part of the country can count and we can pretty well find the hearing rooms with the numbers on them but if you put a George Norris room in here or an Abe Lincoln or a George Gerdes, people from western Nebraska--they have a hard
