SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, that is fine. Who would be the person that would make that decision?

SENATOR NEWELL: I prefer to give that to the Historical Society, that responsibility for the actual contracting and developing as opposed to making that decision that one of the members of the body would make.

SENATOR NICHOL: Would that be up to your committee that you are serving on?

SENATOR NEWELL: Well the committee would naturally have to work out any arrangements for these contracts but I think that they would ask someone to take that responsibility.

SENATOR NICHOL: Fine, thank you, Senator Newell.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President. I guess this would be a question for Senator Newell or else I will make it as an amendment. I gather from the conversation, Senator Newell, that the sub-committee will develop some guidelines, criteria prior to the selection of people that would be followed. My suggestion would be that if that is done that those criteria would be brought back to the body before any names are discussed for approval and do you think that would be possible? Would you be willing to agree that that is what is going to happen?

SENATOR NEWELL: I have no problem with that. I think that might be a very formalized way of doing it which may save some floor fights when we bring the next...

SENATOR WARNER: I am hesitant to see us get tied up with a lot of arguing whether it should be between two people, dealing with individuals. I would hope that we could deal with some criteria.

SENATOR NEWELL: I think I will offer that to the sub-committee and I will propose that we bring it back. Again I want to remind you that a provision of the resolution says that the Historical Society shall make recommendations. The purpose for that is to try to minimize as best we can the politics of who should be recognized.
