SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The amendment is not adopted. Now, Senator Newell, are you ready to close on your amendment?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you move the adoption of the amendment?

SENATOR NEWELL: I move the adoption and then for a close I would simply say that I will take Senator Warner's proposal to the sub-committee and bring back, I hope there will be agreement to this, to bring back certain rules and guidelines under which we would make these selections. Again I want to emphasize the actual selections themselves will be limited or should be limited as the resolution say to only those that the State Historical Society recommends. I would think that the actual contracting of portraits and so forth could also be done by the State Historical Society with some limitations on cost by the Executive Board. I think that some of the other questions that are brought up as to who might be recommended and so forth have been legitimately discussed and I hope I have provided the best answers possible. I do propose that these be political figures since this is a legislative and a political body and one of my proposals is that Governors not necessarily be recognized, that people in this legislative body or has provided something to the Legislature would be those who would be most likely recognized. So for that reason I move the adoption of the resolution and thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the adoption of the Newell amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am sorry.

SENATOR NEWELL: This is on the full resolution, isn't it?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR NEWELL: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? We are voting on the Newell resolution. Have you all voted? Record.
