SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, do you wish to be recognized on the motion?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I move the previous question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Previous question has been called for. Five hands. Okay. Senator Haberman called. All those in favor of the Legislature ceasing debate vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. The Legislature ceases debate. Senator Chambers, do you wish to close? Senator Chambers waives closing. The Clerk will read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers moves to reduce the salary of the Chaplain to 30 silver dollars.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, record vote has been requested. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote found on Pages 189 and 190 of the Legislative Journal.) 7 ayes, 21 nays, 15 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Before we proceed, I wish to recognize in the south balcony 55 Seniors from Northeast High School in Lincoln. Their Senator is Senator Wesely. Let's welcome the group up in the south balcony. I would indicate to the group that the Legislature is still in its initial phase. We are now asking for additional bills to be submitted. They will be put on the Clerk's desk and read by title, and then in about 30 minutes some of these bills will be referred by the Executive Board. So if there doesn't seem to be too much business today, it's simply that we are in the initial stages of our activity. Do you have some more bills? Okay, the Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills. (Read bills by title for the first time, LB 259 - LB 266. See Pages 190, 191 and 192 of the Legislative Journal.)
