SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, but the purpose of it was so that we didn't have to have a bill in each year to do this merely for the purpose of allowing them to charge enough so that they could go ahead and do it without bringing in a bill each year. It is not to make a profit or to take a loss. Maybe you would like to amend it "shall be the same" but I don't know if they could...

SENATOR WARNER: Well I assume in some instances cost might be difficult to ascertain.

SENATOR NICHOL: That is right.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, could you come up to the front and visit with the Clerk for just a moment?
