to get the receiver and the cost of that receiver is \$59.00 as I said.

SENATOR STONEY: Senator Koch, I thought perhaps this had been mentioned in the hearing and that is the only reason I asked that question. Thank you.

SENATOR KOCH: We talked only to the radio broadcast, the reading, the kinds of programs that they would be receiving.

SENATOR STONEY: Thank you, Senator Koch. One additional statement, that being that I certainly agree with the concept of the bill but we should be alerted to the fact that we have now added another category, that being the physical handicapped and I question whether or not those programs will be identical to those that will be offered to the visually impaired so we should consider what the additional fiscal impact might be and additionally with reference to the language that provides that services can be provided for the blind to include but not be limited to radio programs. There may be other items that also will impact fiscally so I think this should be taken into our consideration before our final determination is made. Thank you.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel at this point for an announcement.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We need to break in just for a moment to announce an Executive Board meeting at ten o'clock underneath the South balcony right over here and we have until ten fifteen to debate this issue.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right. Executive Board at ten o'clock. That is in a couple of minutes over under the South balcony. The Chair now recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: A question of Senator Koch.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Will you respond, Senator Koch?

SENATOR KOCH: Yes.

SENATOR MURPHY: Senator Koch, the two stations you refer to are operated by whom at the moment?

SENATOR KOCH: Well presently the one in Omaha is operated by the Omaha Public School systems. It is located at Technical High School. The station in Seward is a privately owned station and they buy a wave length from them at \$400 a year for the purpose of carrying the programs. It is an FM station.
