PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The Chair recognizes Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: I have a question, Mr. President, if I might ask it of Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, will you respond.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR DUIS: Senator Warner, do we include in this particular section repeal and revision the thirty-five percent assessed valuation statute?

SENATOR WARNER: You are talking in section 77-112, I assume, and the following sections.

SENATOR DUIS: I only asked you the question, not for action at the present time, but for a peek at it to see that we do.

SENATOR WARNER: I am sure it should if it doesn't and I believe it probably does. I see 77-201 is and I would want to look to make sure. The whole thing is correlated so I am sure it is....

SENATOR DUIS: That I appreciate because many years ago I was in hopes that we wouldn't have that thirty-five percent but we did and I sincerely hope that this will repeal that particular section. Thank you, Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, Senator Warner, you may close.

SENATOR WARNER: I think the thing that has been discussed, Mr. President, I might respond both to Senator Kahle and Senator Vickers comment a little bit further. I think of an example which is excluded. I think there is some that deal with grain checkoffs for example. It seems to me there is one that reads one mill per bushel and that is not affected in here because it doesn't deal with dollars and cents. It deals on a volume so that is not affected at all. It is only those areas where there is a dollar levy for taxation purposes, an ad valorem property tax.

PRESIDENT: The question before the house is the motion to advance LB 187 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.
