LB 76

Mr. President, your committee on Ag and Environment gives notice of public hearing in Room 1520 for February 1.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion on the desk. Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marvel moves to suspend Rule 6, Section 6 (b) so as to take up LB 76 on Final Reading today.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion before the house is the motion to allow us to take up LB 76 constitutionally. Is there any discussion on the motion to suspend the rules? Seeing none, all those in favor of suspending the rules to take up LB 76 on Final Reading vote aye, opposed nay. This will require 30 votes. Have you all voted? The question is the suspension of the rules to take up LB 76 on Final Reading this morning. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion carries and the Clerk will read on Final Reading, LB 76. Will the Sergeants at Arms clear the aisles, clear the legislative chamber? All legislators will return to their desks. We are on Final Reading. All nonlegislative personnel will leave the floor. Is everyone ready for Final Reading? Are all the legislators at their desks for Final Reading? We are waiting for everyone to return to your desks. We will wait until everyone is at their desks so we can begin Final Reading. Thank you, Senator Nichol. I knew that is what you were doing, going to get Senator Cullan to sit down so that is nice. You have about an hour of this morning's session if you would like to get started on Final Reading. Would every member please return to your desks so we can commence Final Reading on LB 76? All right, the Clerk will proceed then with the Final Reading of LB 76.

CLERK: Read LB 76 on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 76 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: Read record vote found on pages 326-327 of the Legislative Journal. 43 ayes, 0 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.
