PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Proceed then to agenda item #6, Select File, LB 124. There are some E & R amendments so the Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move the E & R amendments to LB 124.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments on LB 124. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments on LB 124 signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The E & R amendments to LB 124 are adopted. There is a motion on the desk, Mr. Clerk.
