SENATOR DUIS: Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: So the motion then is the adoption of LR 10 relative to extending sympathy to the family of Randy Schilling. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted and we will then now take up LR 11.

CLERK: Mr. President. (Read LR 11.) That may be found on page 360 of the Journal, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell, will there then be any further discussion or any closing since there is no further request for discussion.

SENATOR NEWELL: I think, you know, to take this in the same sort of context as the first one. I don't want to make a protracted debate. I think that the state, this is small enough measure to give to these two men who gave their lives for the State of Nebraska.

PRESIDENT: So now the motion is on LR 11 extending sympathy to the family of Jack Sinn. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion passes and LR 11 is adopted. We are now ready then for agenda item #8, General File. The first bill on General File is LB 192 and the Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 192. Read title. The bill was originally read on January 10th of this year. It was referred to the Revenue Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Carsten's Revenue Committee, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair will recognize Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move for the adoption of the committee amendments. The amendments that were adopted by the committee in Executive session of January 23rd provide two things. The first part
