LB 97, 98

Initial. Mr. President, members of the body, LB 97 is also a product of the sunset and review process. The legislation reestablishes the Board of Examiners in Physical Therapy as pursuant to the sunset and review process. Again a hearing was held in November and December and the former Public Health and Welfare Committee voted at that point in time to introduce this legislation and continue the existence of the Board of Examiners in Physical Therapy. This bill also contains additional language in section 2 which allows the Board of Examiners in Physical Therapy to adopt rules and regulations as necessary for the performance of their duties pursuant to existing statutes and that these rules and regulations would have the approval of the Department of Health. This language is necessary it was felt by the Performance Review Committee and also by the Public Health and Welfare Committee, this language was necessary to ensure that their rules and regulations, that they had proper statutory authority for promulgating their rules and regulations. Again I would urge the Legislature to advance LB 97.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any further discussion? The motion is to advance LB 97 to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Then we go to LB 98.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 98. I move for the advancement of LB 98 from General File to E & R Initial. LB 98 is also another in the series of bills which relate to the sunset process. The bill continues the existence of the State Anatomical Board and also makes a couple of changes with respect to that particular body.
