SENATOR CULLAN: It is my understanding, Senator Beutler, and I appreciate your raising this question. I think it is a good one. I will obtain the proper statutory references for you and provide them to you prior to the time that this bill advances from Select File. It is my understanding that the State Anatomical Board already does have this authority in a different section of statute which is not listed and that was not true in the case of the Physical Therapy Board, and due to the oversight in the case of the Physical Therapy Board, we thought it was necessary to add that to ensure that the rules and regulations that they promulgated did have proper statutory authority. I will obtain those proper statutory references and provide them to you, Senator Beutler.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR FOWLER: I have an amendment on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Fowler moves to amend LB 98, on page 2, line 17, to read "and one living lay person".

SENATOR FOWLER: Last year there was a rather insane effort to try and put dead people on this Board as consumer representatives and I think that it should just be clarified that when we are talking about a lay person that we mean someone that is alive as a consumer representative, and for that reason, I think the word "living" should be inserted before "lay person" just to clarify the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there a second to the motion? Senator Cullan. The motion loses for want of a second. Senator Cullan, do you wish to advance the bill now?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, I would be happy to second Senator Fowler's motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 98 to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is to advance the bill to E & R for review. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 7 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.
