PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion then is the introduction of Request #775 by the Agriculture Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It will require 30 votes. Have you all voted? Senator Lamb, I guess we will have to have a Call of the House because I am not going to wait all day for.... We have five other requests in the next five minutes so if you want to get through it somebody better either vote or we will have a Call of the House and get it over with. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I move for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right, all those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring in all the legislators who are not on the floor. All legislators will return to their desks. The House is under Call. Record your presence. We will take in call in votes at this time. Senator Clark voting aye. We will take call in votes at this time.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: We will take in call in votes. Register your presence. The House is under Call. Senator Chambers voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Chambers voting aye, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Senator Stoney voting aye. That is sufficient. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Call.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right. The Call is...asking unanimous consent to raise the Call because unless I see some opposition the Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the introduction of the bill.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion passes. Read the bill. Speaker Marvel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Can't we keep ourselves under Call until we get these other four items taken care of?
