CLERK: 10 ayes, 25 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Motion fails. Speaker Marvel, would the Speaker want to suspend the rules to take this bill up on Final Reading today then? The debate is over. The motion failed to return. It is before us if you want to make a motion we can take it on Final Reading. Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Speaker Marvel moves to suspend Rule 6, Section 6 so as to read LB 150 on Final Reading today.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: All right, is there any discussion on the motion to suspend the rules to take it up on Final Reading? All those in favor of suspending the rules to take up LB 150 on Final Reading today vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 30 votes. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion carries. The rules are suspended, however, we have a motion on the desk. Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers moves to return LB 150 to Select File, the amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, to be completely frank with you as to why I did this, I didn't realize debate would be cut off before I could ask Senator Pirsch a question and this is the only way I can ask it and I think the issue is important. Senator Pirsch, would you yield to a question? This is most serious.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Senator Pirsch, would you respond to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you gotten any information that this bill may have constitutional problems with it, what it is attempting to do?
