PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: I don't know whether it is or not. That is up to you.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Koch, do you have any idea what it is going to be?

SENATOR KOCH: I am sorry, Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Koch, is this bill going to be held with other bills on Final Reading or on E & R Engrossing until the end of the session until we get down to the nitty gritty of what we are spending or....?

SENATOR KOCH: I don't know what the agreement has been consummated here on the floor but I think I stated earlier that we would hold the bill until the A bill reaches the same position. Whether or not we are going to hold them all and make a determination before we pass any bill that has some fiscal impact, I think that the body must decide that.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: On the A bill of course the rules require that you can't read it on Final Reading until you have the A bill so that would take care of that part of it. Any further discussion? All those in favor of the Koch amendment adding the emergency clause vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion passes. The amendment is adopted. Motion on the desk. Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch now moves to amend LB 124: "On line 24, page 2, strike the language "but not be limited to".

SENATOR KOCH: That amendment is not germane since we adopted the emergency clause. Would you please withdraw it.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Unanimous consent to withdraw. Any objections? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, finally, Senator Haberman moves to indefinitely postpone LB 124.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Yes, our rules do require that this shall lay over because... at least until tomorrow. You can not take it up until the next legislative day so it will be laid over. Proceed then with LB 192. The Chair
