SENATOR KELLY: That is correct.

SENATOR DWORAK: It can be done now.

SENATOR KELLY: It cannot be done now.

SENATOR DWORAK: I think it has been done, hasn't it?

SENATOR KELLY: No, it has not been done.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: A question of Senator Kelly, please. Why could this not have been done before the ten day limit expired?

SENATOR KELLY: I would say inefficiencies.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: Mr. President, members, since I am on that committee, I would like to point out, too, that the bondholders are not being bailed out for the simple reason that these bonds, this building is going to be purchased at much less in any case, I am sure, than what the original bondholders have invested. So I think that makes a very good point. A new building would cost probably double what a building that can be purchased and remodeled for the same necessary job to be done.

PRESIDENT: Do you have any closing, Senator Kelly, on your request? Request #782 is before you whether to introduce the bill. It requires 30 votes. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Voting on Senator Kelly's request #782, Building Maintenance Committee.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Chairman, we need another vote. No, I guess we need two votes. I'd ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to introduce the bill, Mr. President.
