they stand and be recognized? Welcome to your Legislature. Stand up, folks, from Senator Sieck's District. Proceed then, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Request #813 is a bill which was requested by the Secretary of State's Office and it is a bill drafted to close and clarify some of the provisions of certain brand inspection laws. There is a loophole in the present law which allows some livestock to be shipped to the slaughterers that has never been inspected for true ownership. It also includes a blanket Class II misdemeanor for thirteen various penalties now that carry a penalty varying from Class V to Class II and I move adoption or for introduction of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, did you wish to...all right. Any further discussion? All those in favor of introducing Request #813 vote aye, opposed nay. This will require 30 votes for the bill introduction. The House is still under Call. Would all legislators return to their desks? The House is under Call. Record the vote. Let's just stay under Call until we get this finished. Otherwise, everybody will leave.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to introduce.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is introduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bill, LB 564. Read title. (See page 426, Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Next item on the agenda is Request #824, Senator Chambers request, and I believe, Senator Chambers, this will require a suspension of the rule. Now, is it a committee bill, Senator Chambers? All right. So who is going to handle it, you, Senator Chambers? The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers on Request #824. Proceed, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, this is a bill which was drafted in response to a problem detected by the Chief of the UNL Police Department. There are a number of law enforcement agencies throughout the state which have the power to make arrests and otherwise enforce laws, but because of the way the current law is drafted with reference to training of law officers, it lists those who must receive training, the State Patrol, County Sheriffs, Police Officers in villages and so forth, but by listing each one and not listing these, they were excluded.
