SENATOR KOCH: Senator Clark, I think....

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator, go ahead.

SENATOR KOCH: I am sorry, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Go ahead.

SENATOR KOCH: I think Senator Dworak has a similar motion, but if I might use the floor for a moment, Senator Clark, I might concede.

SENATOR CLARK: I don't have that much time.

SENATOR KOCH: Am I on your time?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes. The only thing is Senator Dworak tried to do this. He couldn't take it off. I think I can take it off, if that is your concern?

SENATOR KOCH: That is a major concern of mine, and one more, Senator Clark, while I am after it, is that I am a little concerned at this crash program that these people have on that tall document you showed me yesterday is only a crash program. I would believe that these people would have to pass an examination to indicate to the Examiners Board that they are indeed skilled in using therapeutic drugs.

SENATOR CLARK: I think you just read the intent in there. They have taken it, have taken a five hour examination already.

SENATOR KOCH: They have taken a five hour examination?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Clark, Senator Clark, in the interest of compromise, I will withdraw my kill motion if you take miotics and the emergency clause off, in an emergency.

SENATOR CLARK: And I would have permission to take up that motion right now to keep my commitment to him. I wonder if the Clerk would read that motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You can read the motion but then I have to go back to Senator Koch. Read the motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Clark moves to strike in the original Clark amendment which was adopted on General File "miotics for emergency purposes only". That is offered by Senator Clark.
