

They have been able to raise \$9,000 in the business community and through other kinds of endeavors, yet these same three people operate Program two different stations. That is amazing to me, and as Senator Cullan said to me the other day, Senator Koch, you know when you figure that out that is really not very much money per person served who is visually handicapped and legally blind. \$31,000. Mr. Haberman could spend that on a boat and never miss it. Here we are, \$31,000, and we are going to make a big issue out of it and we have it in letter, and I know Mr. Parker well enough to know that he is a man of his word, if he said within three years he will try to phase this program out so it becomes self-sufficient, he means that. Just like he is so independent when you watch him walk with a white cane he doesn't even want you to help him. He wants to help himself and most of the blind people I know want to help themselves and we, as a body here, have an obligation to help them in time of need and they are saying to us for possibly three years, help us, and we will try to become efficient and completely self-sufficient and I will take their word for it. We have a bill that also deals with veterans. It is to build a trust fund. It is LB 88 and we will be willing to put a million dollars in there to help veterans who are needy and I bet not many people in here will oppose that bill when it comes to the floor. We will all put our flags on and our blue caps and gold buttons and we will parade. Now for \$31,000 we are going to say we can't afford it and, ladies and gentlemen, I submit to you we can afford it and I ask you to oppose the motion to indefinitely postpone.
