LB 31, 90

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Senator Kremer, will you respond?

SENATOR KAHLE: Does this mean then if we are able to leave the federal government out that the people that are going to do this work in a local area would not have to obtain some twenty-nine permits from the federal government before they could start to do the job?

SENATOR KREMER: If no federal funds are involved and the federal government is not participating in a project and the project is sponsored by and paid for by a local subdivision of government they need not go to the federal government.

SENATOR KAHLE: And that would eliminate this one problem that we have had all along with all these different agencies that get to okay the project.

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Kahle, unless the federal government is involved, then they must get their approval of course.

SENATOR KAHLE: Well I most certainly do support this then because I think that has been one of the terrible drawbacks we have had any time you wanted to do something locally. You had to get all this permission from the federal government and it is almost impossible. Thank you.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: Is there any further discussion on LB 31? If not, I guess, Senator Kremer, you may close.

SENATOR KREMER: No closing. I move that LB 31 be advanced to E & R.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: No closing. The motion then before the house is the advancing of LB31 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. The next bill on General File is LB 90.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 90 was a bill introduced by Senator Robert Clark of the 47th. (Read title to LB 90.) The bill was first read on January 5. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. The bill was advanced directly to General File, Mr. President.
