PRESIDENT: Did that answer your question, Senator Keyes?

SENATOR KEYES: It confuses me now.

SENATOR KREMER: That is the shortest answer I can give.

PRESIDENT: Anything further then, Senator Clark? The question then is the introduction of the bill in Request #789 by the Public Works Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This will require 30 votes. Have you all voted? Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, these are bills brought in by the Department of Roads that they say are very, very necessary and I would have to ask for a Call of the House to get them in, just so we can hear the bills anyway. It is for Omaha.

PRESIDENT: Motion is for a Call of the House. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Have you voted? Voting on a Call of the House. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion passes. The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring in all members of the Legislature. All members of the Legislature will return to their desks. All nonlegislator members, staff, will leave the floor. The House is under Call. Register your presence. Senator Duis, would you register your presence? Senator Hoagland, would you register your presence? Yes, the Chair will accept call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Warner had voted aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner had voted aye.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting aye. Senator Frank Lewis voting aye. Senator Hoagland had voted aye. Senator George voting aye. Senator Maresh voting aye. Senator DeCamp voting aye. Senator Pirsch changing from no to yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, could we have a roll call vote?

PRESIDENT: Has everyone registered their presence? Senator Goodrich and Senator Chambers are the only ones we know of that are in the building that are not here. Senator Dworak is voting aye. We will accept call in votes at this time.
