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a school is using a different colored bus, they do not have the traffic control and they cannot stop traffic like a school bus does for children getting on and off. It is at their discretion if they want to use a different color, I am sure, but they cannot use it for traffic control. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, a question of Senator Nichol, I guess you are the one. I don't see Senator Koch here. Does this law apply to church schools?

SENATOR NICHOL: No.

SENATOR MARESH: This is just for public schools?

SENATOR NICHOL: As I understand, just public schools.

SENATOR MARESH: So if a church school has a bus, they don't have to comply with the bus law?

SENATOR NICHOL: That is as I understand it, yes, now, the way the law is now.

SENATOR MARESH: They don't have to have the stop arm, flashing lights, anything like that?

SENATOR NICHOL: I don't think so.

SENATOR MARESH: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Did you wish to speak again?

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I would like to ask Senator Kahle a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kahle, will you respond?

SENATOR NICHOL: The question, Senator Kahle, I am sure we are both thinking in the same direction and the purpose of dolling up school buses or any bus is to protect the children inside, that is correct so far? Now why would it not be okay if a church or a church school buys a bus to leave the color on? I agree that perhaps you want to take away the safety devices such as the arm that protrudes when you want to have children get off. Perhaps all those should be taken off, but what is the matter with leaving a school bus, that's
