SENATOR REUTZEL: I move the Call be raised.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendments are adopted and the Call has been raised. Now if there are no other amendments the Clerk recognizes Senator Reutzel to advance the bill.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. Speaker, I move the advancement of the bill. Section 37-1201 and 37-1274 which we revised, those were the inserts the committee amendments inserted in line 14 and 15, excuse me, 12 and 13 of the act, only relate to the boating act. The statute numbers on page two were wrong and I move for the advancement of the bill to E & R.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, is a question still in order of the introducer?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes. Go ahead and ask him the question.

SENATOR KOCH: A question of Senator Reutzel.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Reutzel, what precedent will this establish for other kinds of things, for instance, a Nebraska University football ticket?

SENATOR REUTZEL: Senator Koch, we went through that before. I don't think it is going to establish any kind of a precedent. As Senator Lamb brought up, you can do anything in here you want with 25 votes. I think we are dealing with one section here. We are dealing with a situation which does not come up very often but the Game and Parks Commission would like to deal with the situation to the families who approach them and ask for the refund. I don't think it is a monumental bill by any stretch of the imagination. The sun is going to rise tomorrow regardless of what we do to this, and if we want to give refunds to anything else, all someone has to do is to introduce the bill and try to get 25 votes.
