CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The committee amendments are adopted. Now on the bill as amended and the Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right there is no further discussion so all those in favor of advancing LB 114 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 9 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LB 114 is advanced to E & R Initial. The Clerk may read in.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined LB 9 and find the same correctly enrolled, signed, Senator Wesely, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of doing business I propose to sign and I do sign LB 9.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a Rules Committee report regarding action on proposed rule changes. (See page 509 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your committee on Public Works gives notice of public hearing in Room 1515 for February 23, March 7 and March 8, signed, Senator Kremer, Chairman.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then with agenda item #7, continuing General File with LB 112.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 112 was a bill introduced by Senator Maurice Kremer of the 34th. (Read title to LB 112.) The bill was first read on January 8 of this year. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. The bill was advanced directly to General File, Mr. President.
