LB 67

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 67 was a bill introduced by Senator Smirley Marsh of the 29th. (Read title to LB 67.) The bill was read on January 5 of this year. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. There are committee amendments pending by Senator Maresh's Business and Labor Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Maresh, Chairman of the Business and Labor Committee for the committee amendments. Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Chairman, Senator Marsh brought these amendments to the committee and so I will let her explain her amendments.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Marsh, you will carry the committee amendments.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the amendments were requested through the Attorney General's office. He said it was a duplication of language and that this is their suggested way to solve the problem. I move for the adoption of the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on the motion to adopt the committee amendments on LB 67. If not, all those in favor of adopting the committee amendments will vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? We are voting on the committee amendments on LB 67.

SENATOR MARSH: We need three more votes on this to adopt the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The committee amendments are adopted. The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 67 does not provide for any changes. It simply is a clarification of what has been state law. Originally when this legislation was passed state and local subdivisions were excluded. Back in 1967 this exemption was expressly removed. Now it needs to be clarified because of court decisions and I move the advancement of LB 67 to E & R Initial.
