CLERK: Mr. President, Legislative Bill 38 was a bill introduced by Senator Bernice Labeledz of the 5th. It's a bill for an act to amend Section 81-1108.43. (Read title of LB 38.) The bill was first read on January 4. It was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans' Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are amendments pending by Senator Keyes' Government Committee, Mr. President. (See Pages 519 and 520 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes.
