We had a couple of doctors that were performing services in Omaha that were drawing a pay from the State of Nebraska, or from the University Hospital and were also charging for a service, and I just wanted to find out how much that was. That amendment went on the bill at 10:30...11:00 in the morning, and by noon they had completely moved out...re-signed and moved out of the University Hospital. I obtained what I wanted. When those two men went out, I was thrilled. The only one that I understand, that has ever obeyed this was Varner. Nobody else has filed it. I am very concerned about when we hire somebody...pay them 25 or 30 thousand dollars a year and then they spend a great deal of their time writing a book in Spain, or they spend a great deal of their time lecturing around the country, for which they get paid, I'm very concerned about that. But, I accomplished what I wanted to with that amendment, and Senator Murphy, if you want to put that on as a bill, or amend this bill, I'm not so sure that I will support you but I certainly will look with a certain amount of gratification upon it. So, thank you.
