SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, how many are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Six are excused.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Six are excused.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We're still trying to find about four legislators. Senator Keyes, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KEYES: Roll.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pardon?

SENATOR KEYES: Let's call the roll. I'm asking for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Carsten, do you want a roll call vote now?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Let's do it when we get them here, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I remind the members that we are under call and you must be in your seats, please. We're on LB 211. We're about to proceed with a roll call vote on Legislative Bill 211 as amended. Senator Carsten, you wish to proceed with the roll call now? I think all of them...

SENATOR CARSTEN: How many of them are not excused that are not here?

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are two.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, that's close enough. Let's proceed.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Continued roll call as found on Page 529 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is advanced. Senator Carsten, you moved that the call be raised. The call is raised. We will pass over 509 and we will go to Senator...are we ready for 145, Mr. Clerk?
