LB 108, 287

SENATOR MARSH: The Clerk will commence the roll call.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See pages 539 and 540, Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Duis has just come into the Chamber. Would you care to cast a vote on the advancement of LB 108 from General File to Enrollment and Review. Do you care to vote, Senator Duis? Go ahead, Patrick.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SENATOR MARSH: The bill will remain where it is. We are now ready and will...the Call has been raised. We will now hear LB 287.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 287. Read title. The bill was first read on January 16. It was referred to the Public Works Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Kremer's Public Works Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Recognize Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, members, the amendment adopted by the Public Works Committee was at the request of the Department of Roads. It strikes the new language on page 5, if you would like to turn to it, that has to do with the weighing of this special permit vehicle. If the scale is closed, they are privileged to go onto the next scale and be weighed. It also strikes subsection 7 on page 6 that would require the Department of Roads to periodically review and revise their rules and regulations in issuance of these special permits. Now why they want it I do not know. I was not present when the bill was heard and Senator Clark chaired the committee. If Senator Clark has additional information as to why the Department of Roads wanted this language stricken, he can address himself to it. If not, I am sure Senator Warner, the introducer of the bill, would give the reason, could give the reason, but what I explained is what it does. I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to adopt the committee amendments to LB 287. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Senator Warner, you are still voting white.
