

that bill will ultimately be upheld as constitutional. It is to say that in those areas where there are legitimate doubts as to what is or is not constitutional, they are hopefully in a form as I say, that the courts can rule on the merits and in those areas where there need to be clear cut changes we have made them. Further it is not to say that the pro-life groups love this bill or that the pro-choice groups who you will hear from here, think it is a wonderful bill because none of them, none of them have in it all the things that they would like. It is indeed in the true sense of the word, in the truest sense of the word, a compromise and I would hope it would be acceptable, that you would adopt the amendments and push the bill on as rapidly as possible, and I say as rapidly as possible because in order for these matters to be legitimately tested in the courts the new legislation has to be in proper form and with some expediency. The amendments have not arrived as you all have guessed by now and I have now talked quite a while telling you that they are going to arrive and I also am wondering, Mr. Bildrafter, when those amendments are going to arrive. When they do, you will receive a copy and I will explain the amendments in some detail. Having exhausted all the things I can say merely in a conversational tone and not having the amendments before me, I think somebody else should talk for a while.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, you have three minutes left so I will make note of it. The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak and then Senator Chambers. Senator Dworak, do you want to be recognized?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, I really don't see how we can continue to debate this or even discuss it until we have these amendments before us. I really don't think there is anything to say at this point from either side until we see what we are debating and that has not been brought up before the floor yet. I wonder if maybe it wouldn't be prudent to maybe go on to another piece of business, Mr. Speaker, until we get these amendments on the floor because everything seems to revolve around these. I personally haven't seen these amendments yet and I don't think anybody other than the two or three people with Senator DeCamp that has been in these meetings have any concept or any idea what is in them.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I have just learned they are being xeroxed at this moment, the copies.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to withdraw your other amendments?
