SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to speak to a division of the question? Go ahead.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would strongly object to any division of the question. In trying to work these out, in trying to arrive at a solution, in trying to resolve the conflicts from both sides pieces were put together as part of a whole and if you start pulling this piece out and altering it, changing this, I think you jeopardize everything. I do not believe we can take any part out without jeopardizing the whole. For that reason I would object and I do understand why Senator Chambers would want to argue individual pieces but I just do not think it will work.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, is the balance of your discussion....

SENATOR DeCAMP: It was the understanding of all those who worked on it and nobody was precluded from ever working on this. Every side was asked to come down. They were invited and they did and the understanding of all of them I think is, you can only take the whole thing together.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, is the balance of your discussion contingent upon a ruling at the moment from the Chair or can you proceed with the discussion and then we will come back to the rule?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think I would probably need the division because if I can't get it then I am going to have to try to discuss everything in the bill and the amendments in five minutes, so I would have to get the division of the question and since I made the offering, apparently I am going to have to move because I think Senator DeCamp has objected. I move for a division of the question and I will discuss why. No thing that comes on this floor is sacred and immune to amendment, discussion or any handling that the Legislature decides to give it.
