SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak and then Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I rise in opposition to the kill motion. I, in my opinion, this bill is constitutional. I think these provisions in Judge Urbom's plenary injunction, temporary injunction, have been answered. I think we have to remember every bill we pass can have the cloud or be constitutionally suspect. It is one man's opinion as to whether a bill is constitutional or unconstitutional. I think the bill is proper. It is correct. It is in complete compliance with the constitution. I keep hearing opponents to the bill referring to these constitutional suspect sections. I realize that Judge Urbom in his ruling indicated that certain sections in the current statute are constitutionally suspect. He did not say they were unconstitutional. That was merely a preliminary opinion, a preliminary injunction. That was not a final decision by Judge Urbom and that is not the final tribunal, so I think the bill is constitutional and I think at this point my opinion is just as valid as Senator Chambers' or anybody else's who thinks the bill is not constitutional and I think that opinion will stand until it is tested in the courts. So I rise against Senator Chambers' motion. I think we go ahead and pass this bill which has been strengthened, which has been corrected, where we have taken the constitutional doubt out of it and I think we have a solid piece of legislation.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr. President, I call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I see five hands. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers for purposes of closing on his kill motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, instead of a close...I am going to waive my closing. I would ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.
