SENATOR KREMER: Groundwater Conservancy District?

SENATOR MARESH: Yes.

SENATOR KREMER: No, sir.

SENATOR MARESH: So that is why I am saying that probably they like if in your area and my area they are levying half a mill. Aren't they? Is that correct?

SENATOR MARESH: So what we are saying that the NRD could not go to the full three quarter mill. All they could, in our area, go up to a half mill.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Senator. I would like to ask Senator Haberman a question. Senator Haberman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb. Just a minute, Senator Lamb. Is he asking Senator....?

SENATOR KREMER: I am asking Senator Haberman a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Will you respond?

SENATOR KREMER: Can you tell me how much the Groundwater Conservancy District in your area is assessing today?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I can't hear you, Senator.

SENATOR KREMER: Pardon?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I can't hear you.

SENATOR KREMER: My question was, do you know how much a Groundwater Conservancy District in the Upper Republican is assessing today? They can assess one mill, not the NRD now. I am talking about the Groundwater Conservancy District and there are a few of them in Nebraska, five in my area and I think there are three out in your area in Chase and Dundee County.

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, I do not.
