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was a vote of the people and then somebody else said it wasn't. Thirdly, is there some very clear and definitive criteria for establishing a control area?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR LEWIS: Is there any possibility forthly that Sarpy County and Douglas County would be in a control area?

SENATOR KREMER: Is there a possibility they would be under a control area?

SENATOR LEWIS: Yes.

SENATOR KREMER: I guess anything is possible. It is possible for the world to come to an end. I would say nothing is impossible in this area. We are adding new criteria, Senator Lewis, in the bill we have today and that has to do with water quality so if that would prevail, in your area I would suppose it would be a reason why the people in your area could go to your NRD and say we ought to consider going under control. At that time the Department of...or the Department of, I always get it mixed up, the Department of Water Resources. It is the Department of.....

SENATOR LEWIS: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Mr. President, again, I am certainly unclear in the direction we are going here. I am also unclear by the thrust of some people in terms of....and I recall two or three of them around the room now in terms of property tax and the arguments that they made and particularly in some of the areas where that the crises was so great that there was a lack of survival and now, Mr. President, and I apologize. It is my fault that I don't know more about the water issue. I do know, Mr. President, that we are talking about a huge sum of money at this time. We are talking about, I would estimate, somewhere in the neighborhood of a maximum of \$5,000,000 a year for this kind of project. That is based on all the assessments, Senator Kelly. If somebody has got the correct information, I know we have more than \$5,000,000,000 in terms of real estate valuation. I think that we need to spend the money necessary for water. Now I have, Senator Kremer, supported every appropriation bill for water that has been before this body. I think a better alternative now, a better alternative now would either limit the service
