

that we have before us and I know that Senator Kremer is capable of answering those questions, much more so than I am or anyone else and that is the only way we are going to get it done. Senator Lewis wants a private conversation with Senator Kremer but that does not answer my questions or Senator Hasebroock's questions or Senator Kelly's questions so if we would give Senator Kremer the opportunity to take this bill section by section, line by line, and give us a chance to answer those questions. We can not spend our time in this body any more beneficially, not for the Legislature, but for the people of the State of Nebraska than to allow him to do that and so, Mr. Chairman, if I am not out of order, I would like to move that Senator Kremer be given the amount of time necessary to answer questions from anyone on the floor who might have a question relative to the bill and that he be allowed to proceed at the first section and go through it in that manner.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, I have about eight lights on and it would appear to me without trying to dictate to these members who indicate that they want to speak, that it would be helpful in following your suggestion, if they would pose questions to Senator Kremer, that he then could answer. Now the other way to do it and he did go through the bill briefly section by section but I would like to try with the membership and see if we can develop questions to Senator Kremer. If this does not work then of course the Chair has to abide by the lights but before this is over, hopefully before we adjourn today, Senator Kremer would have adequate time to close and in the closing to answer several questions. So I would like to try that and see if that would work.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. Chairman, may I make a comment or ask a question? I also do not want to take away from anyone the right to answer a question but I have been on the other end, the same end as Senator Kremer is on this legislation many times and I have found it expedient and it expedites the work of the Legislature if we allow the procedure that I have suggested to be implemented and I do not believe in the long run that it will take away from anyone the right to speak. So in any case if you would want to proceed, is it or is it not proper to offer the motion or should I just withdraw the motion?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Why don't you withdraw the motion temporarily....

SENATOR SCHMIT: I so do. I do so.
