

SENATOR KELLY: I am in this same area. I can't imagine what agencies that DEC would use unless it would be counties or NRDs and if they would use NRDs we may need this authority in there for the NRDs to react. Another question that I have, Senator Kremer, is on page 5, line 15, we are using four words in there that should be talked of which is "socio-economic". That is halfway understandable by me but "administrative factors" blows my mind. I need a little guidance in what "administrative factors" might be.

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Kelly, which line are you referring to?

SENATOR KELLY: 15, on page 5.

SENATOR KREMER: Oh, page 5, sorry. We did talk about that some. When we talk about administrative factors, what authority does the county have, where does another level of government that has certain administrative authority. To me that is what it means, factors that deal with... could be, yes, it could be counties.

SENATOR KREMER: I'm not sure your question can be answered, what would it have to do with the critical area. You are talking about administrative... I suppose in order to be smart I would say I would have to consider your question and do a little bit more looking into what you mean by administrative factors. SENATOR KELLY: At a later date if you would advise the Legislature for the record of what...

SENATOR KREMER: I will certainly attempt to do that.

SENATOR KELLY: ...what administrative factors might be.

SENATOR KREMER: I think, Senator Kelly, I mentioned a while ago I certainly don't know all the answers before but I will do my best to get...
