

of law that a criminal statute be reasonably clear and definite. The present statute requires the common man to guess at its meaning, and thus violates the fundamentals of due process. There presently exists no state careless driving statute. Only those careless driving statutes found in city and village ordinances are in effect now. This proposed bill would adopt wording for a new state careless driving section, which the Supreme Court has indicated would meet constitutional requirements. The new wording indicates the place public highways and the manner carelessly or without due caution of the offense. I would move for the introduction of the bill and beg for 30 votes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: This has to do with Request #855, and the possible introduction of a bill as requested by the Judiciary Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the introduction of a new bill by the Judiciary Committee as read by Senator Nichol. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to introduce the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Go ahead. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 575 was a bill introduced by the Judiciary Committee and signed by the members thereof. (Read by title for the first time LB 575. See Page 624 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have any other Items before we go to Item #6?

CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Item #6 is Final Reading...six bills. Take approximately twenty minutes. Will the members of the Legislature please take your seats and unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. All legislators must be in their seats on Final Reading. We're about to begin Final Reading. We're waiting for all legislators to take their seats. The first bill on Final Reading is LB Number 10. The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, Engrossed Legislative Bill 10 introduced by Senator Reutzel...(Read LB 10 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is shall the bill pass? All those in favor
