SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is readvanded. Now the Clerk has a few items to read into the record.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are now ready for the last miscellaneous motion and for that the Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I have a motion on the desk...don't I, Mr. Clerk? Do you want to make it official? I wouldn't want anything to happen to this.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch moves to reconsider the body's action in the indefinite postponement of LB 141.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I will be very brief. We had a considerable discussion over the proposed Secondary Education Coordinating Commission. Very quickly as the committee amended the bill it allows that commission three types of authorities. Number one, and probably most important, it would permit the commission to review and to authorize requests about state institutions to offer courses in the State of Nebraska.
