It says that when a district like that is being dissolved, the present bill without the amendment would say it has to be...notification has to be through the newspaper, and the Committee felt that it would be more effective and more sure if it would follow the old procedure and a letter has to go to anyone that's involved in an irrigation district like this. That's what the amendments do. I move for the adoption of the Committee amendments.

SENATOR LEWIS: You've heard the move of the Chairman for the adoption of the Committee amendments to LB 66. All those in favor will vote aye. Those opposed will vote nay. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Lewis voting aye.

SENATOR LEWIS: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the Committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR LEWIS: The Committee amendments are adopted. Senator Clark, on the bill itself as amended.

SENATOR CLARK: This is really a pretty simple bill. It just merely puts into statute a method of distributing the money from an irrigation district that is dissolved, that is solvent. Today what our statutes say, this is the way you dissolve one that is insolvent, but this is a solvent irrigation district and all they do is distribute the money according to the way the money was collected in the first place, and that's really all the bill does. I move for the advancement to E & R.

SENATOR LEWIS: The question before the House is the advancement to E & R Initial of LB 66. Those in favor will vote aye. Those opposed will vote no. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Lewis voting aye.

SENATOR LEWIS: Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President on the motion to advance.

SENATOR LEWIS: The bill is advanced.
