the issue but what I am requesting that you do if you look on your agenda, there are two votes that will have to be taken, is take the first one and that will erase the problem of the motion having been made a day too late and by the way, I did it this way pursuant to a request by Senator Wesely because he had a certain time when he wanted the motion to be taken up and I wasn't keeping track of the number of days that had passed so the day that I was going to offer it, I just held it back one day. The following day it was offered and that was one day beyond. So I am asking that you now vote for this first motion.

PRESIDENT: Appreciate your explanation, Senator Chambers, so seeing no other lights, we will vote on the motion to suspend the rule so that we may take up this matter. All those in favor... It requires 30 votes. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay, to suspend the rules so we can take this matter up. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the motion... Senator Wesely, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WESELY: I would hate to have to have a Call of the House but I would like to have some people here on the floor so...

PRESIDENT: All right, we will give them a fraction of a minute or so to get here to vote. Some of them are moving around on the floor after the Call. Give them some time to get to their desks. Have you all voted?

SENATOR WESELY: I will have to ask for a Call of the House then.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely asks for a Call of the House. Clear the board. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, the House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will secure all members at their desks. All nonlegislative personnel leave... All members will return to their desks and register your presence. The House is under Call. Senator Haberman, would you register your presence? Senator Johnson, I believe... Senator Landis, I believe you are there. Senator Marsh is the only one. Senator Shirley Marsh is the only one that is not here. Senator Wesely, shall we have a roll call vote then?
