LB 211

PRESIDENT: All right, okay. Motion is a Call of the House. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the Call of the House? Record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring in those who are not on the floor. All nonlegislative personnel will leave. The House is under Call. All legislators return to their desks and register your presence please as quickly as possible. Register your presence. Senator Clark, Senator Reutzel, Senator Labeledz. Senator Hoagland, are you here? Senator Marvel, I know you are here. Senator Fitzgerald. Senator Schmit, Senator Rumery. Senator Newell and Venditte are the ones that are not here. Senator Venditte is here and Senator Newell is here. Senator Keyes, are you ready? Do you want a roll call vote or what do you want? Roll call vote. Everybody return to your desks. The Clerk will commence the roll call on LB 211.

CLERK: Read roll call vote found on page 736-737 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk cannot hear. Let's have some order. We are voting on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 211. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Continued reading roll call vote. 21 ayes, 22 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Marsh moves the Call be raised. Any objection? The Call is raised. Mr. Clerk, is there a motion on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carsten now moves to amend LB 211. Would you like me to read those, Senator? (Read Carsten's amendment found on page 737 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, all this amendment does is say that once a request is made and that information given, that it cannot be asked for again. One time is sufficient for any of these governmental subdivisions to receive this information and they should not be given the privilege of asking for it again and that is all the amendment does. They only do it once. Thank you.
