PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President and members of the body, I would like to ask Senator Carsten a little bit about that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten, will you respond?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR KAHLE: The bill that was originally written would have required that this information be sent out to the subdivisions of government each month. Now that has been changed. Has it not?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Upon request now, right.

SENATOR KAHLE: If they request will they have to request it each month then if they want to get the information?

SENATOR CARSTEN: No, it is on an annual basis and they have to renew their request but only once.

SENATOR KAHLE: What if they do not request it?

SENATOR CARSTEN: They will not get it is my understanding.

SENATOR KAHLE: So generally it will be the larger subdivisions of government that are the ones who take the most money like the school systems, the NRDs perhaps and the Tech Schools will be the ones that would want this information on a regular basis?

SENATOR CARSTEN: That is my understanding, yes.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on the Carsten amendment to LB 211? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Just a question of Senator Carsten.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten, will you respond?

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Carsten, I don't exactly understand what your amendment is going to do and where did it come from?

SENATOR CARSTEN: It came from me and from some of the county officials that were expressing a concern of having to do a repeat performance once they had done it. You are concerned about the added expense to the county and this will certainly
