SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, that is true, Senator Nichol. It is available upon their request. They can get it. That is true.

SENATOR NICHOL: Now what exactly again is the purpose of the bill if they can get that and those who are interested may have it now?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Upon request, one request, it is automatically mailed to them.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, then why do we really need the bill?

SENATOR CARSTEN: I think that it is a matter of convenience for those that are involved to not have to make the trip to the treasurer's office but that it can be sent by mail.

SENATOR NICHOL: Is there a fiscal note on this, Senator Carsten?

SENATOR CARSTEN: I can't answer. I don't believe there was.

SENATOR NICHOL: Other than just the regular additional bother in the treasurer's office?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Right.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Carsten a question if he would yield please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carsten, will you respond?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Carsten, my county treasurer protested that it would be another expense to which in many instances would be unnecessary that they were always willing to cooperate and that he felt that there would be many of the officials from the ESUs and NRDs who would simply, as a matter of course, request this information and in many instances it would not be of any value to them. They would do it and then the treasurers would be forced to spend the money and take the time to send the reports out each month
