of America and most importantly to the development of airports in the various metropolitan areas, and if we are not careful, we are going to find that general aviation is virtually excluded from the use of this very fine equipment, these very fine facilities. We all recognize the need for some improvements in the handling of equipment around these very congested airports but it has been our experience that once these rules and regulations are adopted that they are perhaps enforced in areas where there is not any really great need and, therefore, I have asked several members of the body who are interested in aviation in general and others who know of its impact upon the general business community of this state to sign this resolution and I ask for its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, I do. I would like to ask a question of Senator Schmit.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: My only concern with the resolution was whether if any safety problems that would result from not doing what is being proposed or how is aviation safety involved with the resolution and the rules you are talking about.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Of course, there was a very serious crash on the West coast as we are all aware of some months ago and it has been the cause for some concern among federal aviation officials. I think all of us are aware of the fact that there is going to be some increase need for safety measures in some areas, but for example, the traffic at O'Hare Airport, the busiest airport in the world, the aircraft land and take off there every thirty seconds, the need for safety measures in that kind of an airspace are much different than what they are in Omaha and Lincoln and this resolution merely asks that they take into consideration the density and the necessity of accommodating local situations and certainly we do not want to sacrifice safety but we do not need to apply the rules of O'Hare to the Eppley Airfield.
