

suppose, to the extent of one dam per Natural Resource District on a farm, fourteen hundred and twenty feet of terraces per Natural Resource District, two acres of waterway, no, one acre of waterway per district. I think those are insignificant amounts unless we want to fund it, you know, substantially. We put a half a million dollars into it. If we want to put five million dollars into it, will we get a hundred dams? That is four per Natural Resource District. I don't think that you are going to make enough difference in the amount of water that goes by Sarpy County with this kind of a program and I have seen over the years many, many programs well designed, well intentioned, that became so diluted that they absolutely did no good. We have never been able to get adequate amount of money in the development fund, and when we divide those funds into numerous areas, we further dilute the responsibility. There is nothing that keeps the commission from using them for small projects now if they want to do so but all we do is take away the advisory board and allow the commission to function as they have in the past.

SENATOR STONEY: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Well, Mr. President, my only concern, I would reiterate from my opening remarks, and that being that we did see fit to enact this law last year. Now Senator Schmit himself said that perhaps funding is the difficulty that we might have. There are not sufficient dollars to accomplish the intent or the purpose of this law. Then I would challenge us as a Legislature to provide sufficient funds so that the law can be effective and can work in the manner in which we wished it to originally. Thank you.
