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individual senator to have as many as he wants. If you have the energy, the imagination, and the enthusiasm that it takes to manage bills from the time you introduce them to the time they get to the floor, then I think that's your responsibility, and I, for one, have opposed limitations ever since I've been here. This rule came about, I recall, from a great man out west who once had eighty bills on this floor, and it bothered some people, but it didn't bother me as a lobbyist and it didn't bother a lot of senators, because he was energetic, he was enthusiastic and sometimes used these bills to whip others into shape. But that was the master at work and I oftentimes think that we lack some of that today, because we do, by rule, gag individual senators. If there are those who wish to do nothing and draw their great sum of salary, four hundred dollars a month, they can do so, but if there are others who wish to introduce thirty bills, and have the courage to put their name by it, that's best. Too often, many of us carry more than we ten and we put them through a committee, and that's where we have one of the biggest abuses of a committee system. But I would hope that this Legislature would study this seriously, would remove the limit upon the individual senators, put the limit upon the committee of ten. The committees, then, would be more judicious in the kinds of bills that they allow their names to appear on, and the senators who want to have as many bills as they think they can handle will have to show the press, his constituents and others that he is willing to put his name on the line, sponsored by Senator Beutler, Senator Koch, Senator Chambers, or others, and then you're going to have to defend them and you know as well as I do, Senator Beutler, that getting on this floor and defending and managing a bill is not the easiest job in the world, particularly if it's got a little weight in it. Now you can take God, motherhood and country, a oneliner, and you may think it's going to be simple, but my experience here has demonstrated that you even get in trouble over motherhood occasionally. You think it's going to sell. It doesn't always do that. But for us to try to come here today and try to amend the rules in the middle of a session I think is absolutely wrong, and we're not thinking well when we attempt to do this. I will introduce the bill...or amendment, Senator Beutler, that will take the limit off the individual senators, put the limit on the committees. This morning we allowed three bills to be introduced. Now, why are we allowing that to happen when we're almost at the midpoint of this ninety day session? Obviously, those bills must have some merit, or either most of us are so weak in our enthusiasm right now, we just say, let them go, we'll wait for them. So, therefore, I oppose Senator Beutler's proposal to limit us further as individual senators. There are other ways which we can handle this.
